Mum: "Hello, Jim. Nice to meet you. I`m Helen Blade!"

Jim: "How do you do, Mrs. Blade!"

Tom: "Well, Jim, see you at noon! Bye!"

Jim: "Ok, Tom. Bye!"

Things to keep in mind

People having the same age (for instance two children) can greet each other by “**Hi**” or “**Hello**”.

When a younger person is introduced to an older one it’s usually polite for the younger person to greet the older by: “**How do you do Mr./Mrs. ...!**”

The older person can greet the younger person by: “**Hi! Hello... (it’s) Nice/Glad to meet you!**”

Whenever we talk about age we must use the verb “to be” and not the verb “to have”.

I **am** 14 years old.

NOT

I **have** 14 years old.

He/She **is** 15 years old.

NOT

He/She **has** 15 years old.
